


The Wednesday night rides are now concluded for the year and guess who the top KMers are. It's a secret! Come to our banquet and find out. Here are the total standings as of September 26:

Watch the fall season paint the countryside on the WHEELING WHEELMEN rides in October. It's a great time for riding.


October 7-8 HILLY HUNDRED. See y'all on an Indiana hill. (You'll need a tow rope.) For details, see L.A.W. Bulletin.
