
A NEW YEAR'S GREETING

Recipe requested by members at the Christmas social at Phyllis Harmon's.

Overnight Cheese Souffle

8 slices day-old bread 6 eggs 2 cups milk 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter melted

1 teaspoon salt Dash pepper 4-ounce package sharp cheese

Remove crusts. Cube bread. Beat eggs in blender. Combine with milk, butter, salt and pepper. Grease 1-quart casserole and alternate layers of bread cubes, egg batter and cheese. End with cheese on top. Refrigerate overnight. Bake uncovered in 325° oven for 1 hour. Makes 6 servings.

Madeline comments a number of other ingredients could be added, if desired: parsley, lightly sauteed vegetables, mushrooms, ham pieces, etc.
