The other clubs he had observed were riding four and five abreast, running stop signs and stoplights and just being a nuisance. I assured her that behavior like that was not tolerated in the Wheeling Wheelmen. We always try to ride within the law. If we do that then we will not only act properly on the road, but also be welcomed by oher drivers and riders. So the next time you are out on your bike on a club ride (especially wearing a club jersey) please remember to act responsibly, I not only put our club name on the line but my own name. I honestly believe that as a club we try to ride courteously and lawfully. Please don't let me down. You never know who might be watching and a prospective club member.

comings of the film. It just shows how real life experiences can help make us all smarter. Let's put all those great cycling tips to us when we are out on the road. Cycling Tip of the Month: Brush your teeth immediately after every ride. Cleansing your choppers rids your mouth of accumulated sugar from sports drinks and leftover globs of energy bars that can cause cavities. Your mouth will thank you.

Ride Courtesy: I have asked this before, but I will try to get this across one more time. As a courtesy to the ride leaders and your fellow riders, how about showing up early for our rides. Some of you still show up at the last minute before the ride starts. You force the ride leader to have to wait for you to make sure you are signed in and have a cue sheet. This also causes the other riders to have to wait for you. Most of us get there at least a half an hour early. This not only gives you time to get your bike ready, but even gives you a little social time. This extra time allows you not to be "last minute" stressed, and lets you enjoy the ride. What if you arrive with a flat tire or other mechanical problem? Yes, this can happen. So please respect your fellow riders and show up at least 15 to 30 minutes early for the rides.

St Pat's Recap: The weather did not cooperate and so the turnout was light. We only had 180 riders this year (Not counting the bandits). The riders that did participate enjoyed the extra touches this year like the home baked cookies and communication and sag support from the McHenry County Wireless Club. Bicycle Advocacy Day!

Arlington Bicycle Company, LLC will be hosting a Bicycle Advocacy Day on Saturday, May 22nd at 45 S Dunton, Arlington Hts from 12 noon to 4 pm.

A CHALLENGING HILLY 100 MILES A DAY RIDE


