BOARD BANTER

The Harmon Hundred is coming September 11th and your involvement is wanted.

Everyone in the club is familiar with the Harmon. Of all the things we do as a club this is our touchstone event. It is the event outsiders most associate with the club, and it is the principal way we make money to fund the good things we do - bicycle advocacy and club events. The Harmon brings in more revenue for the club in one year than two years of dues. A successful Harmon is the single most important thing we can accomplish each year to make our club thrive.

This will be our 42nd Harmon. Our first was back in 1970, which makes the Harmon the oldest invitational bike ride in the northern Chicagoland area. Road biking then was a different sport, without the mainstream appeal we currently enjoy. The original ride started at Wheeling High School, back when Wheeling was the last outpost before the cornfields of southern Lake County. The population of Lake County for that Harmon was 350,000 people, half of what it is today. Traffic was light and the roads were ours. No one gave a second thought to riding three abreast down Route 83. Try that today!

The intervening years have brought many changes to our sport. Cycling has grown in popularity. Carbon frames have replaced steel. Helmets For all this to work we need have become mandatory. And the Harmon, too, has changed. The start has migrated from Wheeling High School, on to the Wauconda Apple Orchard, and finally to its current home in Wilmot. We have hosted more than 20,000 riders who have covered over 1 million miles on every scenic road in the area.

One thing hasn't changed, and that's our commitment to providing the best experience for our riders. Since that first Harmon we've developed a reputation for great routes, great marking, great food, great support, and a friendly attitude. It is our challenge as Wheeling Wheelmen to carry this on in 2011.

This year's Harmon will be Sunday, September 11. Like last year's, the ride will start from Wilmot High School and will provide options for 25, 50, 62, 75 and 100 miles. There will be two rest stops - Eagle Lake Park

and Bassett Park. We've increased and improved our promotional efforts over last year and expect to attract 500+ riders. Everything is coming together for a great ride.

75 volunteers. By late July so far 40 have signed up. For those of you who have already committed, thank you. For those of you who have not yet signed up please see the sign up sheets that will be at all the rides, or contact Todd Berlin at todd.berlin@rrd.com.

There are a lot of ingredients in a successful Harmon. Some we can't control: the weather, or the competition. Some we can: give all of our riders the most outstanding service and experience. We do this by everyone participating any way you can, and delivering it all with a smile and friendly "thank you for coming".

Please help out and let's make this year's Harmon our best ever. Thank you for your support and see you on the road.

WATERFORD RIDE

Have you ever wondered how custom made bicycles are produced? Do you live for riding down tree-lined country lanes? Come out for the Waterford Ride on August 20th.

Waterford Precision Bicycles is the former Schwinn Paramount factory. It was purchased by Richard Schwinn when the remainder of the Schwinn bicycle company was sold in the 1990s. Waterford continues to make steel bicycles that are in demand by racers, tourists and other sporting riders.

Every summer Richard Schwinn opens his factory to demonstrate how his frames are made to local riders. After the tour, he drives support for a ride through the countryside around the Waterford, WI home base. Three options of 27, 41 and 68 miles are available. Arrive by 7:45 for the factory tour which runs from 8:00-8:30. The ride follows. This year our club is riding along with our friends from the Elmhurst Bike Club.

The ride starts at the Waterford factory at 816 Bakke Ave., Waterford, WI. Take I-94 to Hwy 20 West, take Hwy 20 for 14 miles. Turn Left on Hwy D for 1.5 miles to Hwy W. Turn right (north) on Hwy W then 1 mile and left (west) on to Bakke Ave. They're the 4th building on the right.

TOMRV - A Big Fish Story???



Well this was the year I agreed to go on TOMRV (Tour of the Mississippi River Valley). For years I shied away from going because I heard about how crazy hilly it was and that the weather always stinks. But after tackling the hills of Santa Rosa back in April, my new compact crank and my 10 years of vacation karma, I was ready for anything.

The ride is sponsored by the Quad Cities Bicycle Club and leaves on Saturday from Bettendorf, Iowa (106 miles) or from Preston, Iowa (69 miles) and travels to Clarke University in Dubuque, Iowa. On Sunday we return using a different route to Bettendorf (90 miles) or to Preston (46 miles). There are many views of the Mississippi River as we ride along it, over it on bridges, and through it on causeways. The route is hilly near Dubuque, with 6,000 feet of climbing on Saturday and 4,000 feet on Sunday.

Joining the ride with me this year were two other "TOMRV virgins" (Cindy Kessler and Al Gibbs) and several other Wheelmen who were TOMRV veterans (Ella, Rich & Mary Kay, Pat & Brian and Eva).

On Friday afternoon, Cindy Kessler and I drove to Preston, Iowa. Throughout dinner Friday night we were peppered with stories as to how tough the hills were and how scary the bridge crossings can be when wet. Nice images to be dancing in your head the night before a ride.


Saturday morning was cool, grey, damp and head winds, but from what I was told nicer weather than any previous year. (YES, I still got that vacation karma). Most of the roads were quiet and we quickly moved from one well stocked rest stop to the next. As the miles past I kept waiting for some crazy steep or long hills that I'd have to cross train on (euphemism for "walk up"). But it never happened. It really wasn't that bad. All the hills were very doable. There were long climbs but just put it in an easy gear and spin baby spin. I've included an elevation map so you can see exactly what we rode.

Saturday night Cindy and I were able to scam a dorm room. We had been warned not to stay in the dorms since they were not air conditioned. But as you know we haven't experienced summer temps yet so no worries of being too hot. The QCBC hosts a nice buffet dinner at the College free to all riders. We caught up with the rest of the Wheelmen and enjoyed a nice meal. Afterwards in the Atrium there was a band. We just kicked back and continued on from our dinner conversation.

Sunday morning brought us rare sunshine, light winds and warmer temps. Once again at the rest stops veteran riders warned us about these crazy long steep hills. From our experience on Saturday I just laughed off the warnings. The 46 miles flew by and once again there wasn't a hill that wasn't doable.

So if you've been hesitant to try TOMRV, I can't guarantee you great weather, but I can guarantee that the hills are not as bad as they tout it to be. And this is coming from someone who is working on becoming fond of hills. At least after Santa

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10.


