The winter season usually finds most of us spending less time on the bike and more time thinking and reading about the pleasant experiences in store for us when spring arrives. Perhaps, as the Safety Person, I can suggest a few things to read.

First on the list is a book by John S. Allen titled "The Complete Book of Bicycle Commuting." John is a contributing editor for Bicycling magazine. Much of the material has appeared in the magazine but a lot of it is new. Of current interest is a section on winter riding that covers everything from clothing to studded tires. The book is available for short term loan from me or you can order it through the League of American Wheelmen for \$10.95 if you're a member or \$12.95 if not.

Bicycling magazine (Feb.1983) has a couple of articles that are very different than most about safety. "Crashes...Avoiding Them and Living Through Them" by Thomas Prehn is one. It even teaches you how to fall! The other is "Our Optical Blind Spots - A Danger When Cycling." by Dan Henry. We all have this blind spot. Dan tells us how to find it and suggests ways to avoid being hurt by vehicles that are in it.

One of the best articles I have read on traffic technique appears in the American Wheelmen (Jan. 1983). Titled "Cyclo-Boobs Appall E.C. Instructor" (E.C. = Effective Cycling) The article by Dennis Koelmel tells of some of the strange actions he has witnessed while riding 9000 miles during the last year. I would like to quote his closing story. "I followed Lon Haldeman outside of Allentown, Penn., around midnight in his record setting ride only to see him stop at a red light. This was in the country without a car in sight. Lon placed his foot on the ground and waited for the light to change. To me this says it all." My conscience

Both of these fine bicycling magazines are available in the local libraries or from club members, but better yet join the national organization of bicyclists, the L.A.W. and the American Wheelmen goes with membership - get a brochure from Phyllis Harmon or at the club meeting.


