

At this time of the season, when it is still coad and has been for some time, many people, including myself, get restless to begin riding in earnest again. Some resort to wind trainers or other indoor devices, but this does not (at least for me) give the same spirit of freedom that the actual riding does.

One way to have that freedom is to spend at least some of the winter designing some new rides which can still be fitted into this year's schedule, or certainly for next year.

Designing new rides is really quite simple. All one has to do is to sit down with a map and make a cue sheet without any of the distances between points marked in. Once this is done, it is a fairly simple matter to either ride the route in the spring to finalize it, or do the route by car during the winter.

The freedom of the ride can at least be sensed even when one sits in a living room with a map, but there is no need to imagine when out in the car.

I have been following the designcheck pattern to create new rides for the last several years. If a dummy like me can do it, so can you!

We all offer this discount as a courtesy on bicycle accessories and clothing - not bicycles. Other merchandise, unrelated to bicycling does not qualify a bicycle club member for a 10% discount such as skate boards, x-c ski equipment, etc.

When a club member is about to purchase bicycle accessories or clothing, please present a membership card before the merchandise is rung on the register. Please do not ask for the discount loudly in front of other customers. This presents an awkward situation for bicycle shop personnel. Bicycle shop personnel should not have to delete what has been rung into the register and then refigure everything with the

Merchandise that is "on sale" does not qualify for a 10% discount--it is already discounted.

Merchants need to pay a percentage on Visa/MasterCard or Discover Card. As you are receiving a 10% discount please have the courtesy to pay for your purchase with a check or cash. This would be appreciated by the merchant.

We hope to support you as a bicycle club member by working your invitational rides should you ask us. We want to support you by being guest speakers at your meetings. We want to keep your cycling expenditures at a minimum by offering you the discount. We want to keep you as bood customers by keeping you advised as to what is new in the bicycle market.
