nother riding season is behind us. Long and short rides were on the schedule for weekends and holidays throughout the entire riding season. More rides required more volunteer ride hosts. I am really pleased with the great response from the membership in hosting the core rides on our 2001 ride schedule. In addition, many people have stepped forward to host weekday rides to give those members who can ride during the week an opportunity to have organized rides. I specially want to mention Frank Illy for hosting the "Honey-Do Ride" on Saturday mornings along with the Wednesday evening "Hill and Dale Ride". These regularly scheduled rides contributed greatly to our program. Al and Cindy Schneider have hosted their usual quota of long core rides as well as hosting the Elgin Wednesday Evening rides. The "Rides of a Different Flavor" covered 22 unique trail rides covering 1040 miles with 2 more rides on the schedule. All these rides resulted in a grand total to date (Oct 4) of 101,604 miles biked by 149 club members.

Club response to the weekend excursion rides on the other hand has not been overwhelming. A real effort was made to advertise these in the newsletter and other means available to reach the membership. While weather and timing were factors the question is opened to whether these should be attempted next year. Those who worked so hard to line these up seem to want to try again. I would like to hear any comments from the members.

We shift to the semi-dormant winter season in

November through mid-March 16 when we launch the 2002 season with the St Pat's pre-ride. For the intervening months, rides will start Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 10:00 from the Deerfield Bakery. Of course any ride will be put on the ride line that a member wishes to announce to the membership. Give me a call if you are so moved. We hope to see many of you continuing to ride during winter days that are above freezing when the roads are free if ice and snow. Dress warmly, but not too warm, protect the extremities and you will find the short, bracing bike ride a cure for cabin fever.





Dear Cyclists/Advocates

We are very sorry for the "form letter" approach, but we're trying to contact a lot of bike advocates and cyclists fairly quickly. Our apologies. I and some other cycling advocates (John Andersen of Bicycling Life, Ken Kifer, Riley Geary) have been doing research in cycling issues for a couple of years; we became frustrated with the quality of most "cycling surveys" used in the literature, and decided we wanted to try to make a better one. "Better" in our opinion meant that it would be written more from a cyclist point of view than from the point of view of a noncyclist studying cyclists :-)

We're trying to encourage cyclists -- as wide a variety as possible -- to participate in our survey


