2018 NORTH CAROLINA COASTAL RIDE

It was about 18 months ago when Bob Dominski posted on the Wheelmen Yahoo groups page a ride in North Carolina over a long weekend in April. I had half way jokingly agreed with Bob to go if he brings my bike down

for me and I'll just meet him there to ride! I figured, a ride in April in warm weather will be a nice welcome to the start of the riding season. I did that ride with Bob last year and it was such a great ride, I decided that I'd do it again! This time I had added

time, I had added some solicitation to of other traveling cyclist, notably Wheelmen to our list of folks to join us. After some drinks from a cooler last summer, Ella Shields agreed to go with me, so long as Pam Burke would come along. And so Bob and I knew we'd have company of some fine ladies to

ride with this year. What a great time we had. Additionally, the ladies persuaded Johannes and Kathi Smits to join us and a couple of Pam's cycling friends from Barrington as well. We had our own little Chicago area contingent.

The ride took place on 4/20-22. It's a Friday – Sunday ride, where registration begins on Thursday, and the town closes down on Sundays. Cycle North Carolina puts on this coastal ride every year, and they alternate the super small

towns of Oriental, Washington and Eddington every year so that they keep the roads and routes reasonably fresh, and people keep coming back. These towns are all very small, population less than 1000 and with 1500 riders, we totally take over the town for

the weekend. Every place to eat gets swamped. This number though, makes for a manageable crowd. Showers and bathroom lines are not too long with hot water,

security is kept well, food lines aren't too bad, and overall crowds are enough so everyone is friendly and pleasant but not so much that people are blocking each other every which way we go.



shorter ride day Friday, maxing out at 60 miles, a century ride on Saturday, and a 50 mile option on Sunday. It has many of the incremental shorter options down to 5 miles on each of the days. In general, the riding is great—it's flat, scenic, passes through some mid-Atlantic rural

locations where people still sit on their porch and wave the riders by, possibly with moonshine in their hands, but what do I know. The open fields, similar to the empty corn fields northwest of us are very open enabling windy conditions, but the terrain on the Atlantic coast in NC, is really flat. My Saturday 80 miler yielded me an elevation of about

700' — There were two bridges I crossed, and hardly remember any other undulation. The longer rides position their rest stop by the coast, so you can watch the quiet waterways of the Atlan-

tic passages.

The weather this time of the year on the NC coast typically averages sunny, 80 degrees in the day, and 50 at night, but we had it a little colder – 10 degrees less, and it was a nice balmy 60 degrees in Chicago this year that week. Last year, Bob and I rode it at 80 degrees, while it was 35 and rain/hail in Chicago. I felt compelled not to post any sunny pictures and to hide my

Strava details, nor talk too much about my amazing weekend when all my cycling friends were compelled to be at best on their trainer.

For Bob and I, we camped, and every night — Thursday and Friday night this year, there is an unlimited supply of free beer between certain hours in the evening, 5-8 may-

be (?), so all we had to do is stumble and fumble our way back to our tents to sleep. We rode our bikes as ½ mile transport since we didn't quite care to walk, and it did become bike city. We met up with the crew for dinner every night — all 8 of us, which was a lot of fun. Thursday on our own at a restaurant that was inundated with the crowd, and Friday they fed us seemingly unlimited

buffet style food. Live bands played both nights, and in a couple of locations, all in walking distance in the tiny water front town of Washington.

Tent city, where Bob and I stayed was right on the water, and there was this boat, the Belle of Washington – which had a bar and a guy playing live music. It became our nightly

after party, before crashing each night. I remember falling asleep in my tent with the guy still serenading the small crowd. The vibe was very friendly, being down

south coupled with the natural companionship of cyclists.

It was certainly a great ride and a nice warm weather getaway in the spring, I'd recommend to anyone. I was more than happy to ride together with all my friends on Friday in a fun chit chat sort of pace for the first 35 miles, before teeing off and doing the 60, where I jumped onto the slipstream of some faster riders, and working together with them on a reasonably high-speed pace line. I found the

folks in Chicagoland much faster than the fastest riders on this ride.

PROCEDURE PROCESS: IN QUESTIONABLE WEATHER SITUATIONS

If the ride host considers the weather forecast to be severe enough to cancel the ride, he-she should post a message on the Wheeling Wheelmen Yahoo Group wheelingwheelmen@yahoogroups.com These conditions can include very high chance of rain or snow, severe winds, or other unsafe conditions.

- If the ride host decides to cancel the ride, he-she should post a message to the Yahoo group no later than 2 hours before the scheduled ride start time.
- Of course, the host may post the message earlier, like the night before, if there is really no question that the ride will be cancelled. Or, if the host

- wants to decide in the morning, he or she can post a notice to watch for an update in the morning. Generally, more communication is better than less.
- Riders are encouraged to use the Yahoo group, but
 if a rider cannot access the Yahoo group, the host
 can be contacted at the phone number listed on the
 ride schedule.

Every member should consider subscribing to the Yahoo group especially if they are planning on doing rides starting in the outlying areas. Instructions for subscribing to our Yahoo Group are listed on page 7. We also encourage people to join the Wheeling Wheelmen Facebook page and ride information is posted there, too.
